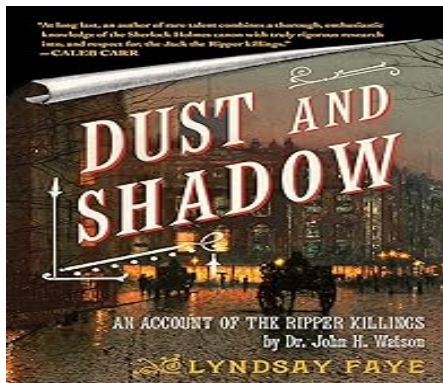

The squalid buildings the misty darkness the lurid feel of the slaughterhouses the colorful people! This was really good! I haven't read actual Sherlock and Watson stories in many years but this has the feel of the stories I remember though the Watson here was far less stupid than I remember the original character to be. **Dust and shadowglen golf** The Ripper's identity was never solved and many have their own pet ideas of who the serial murderer was; Lyndsay Faye puts forth an idea I had had also when thinking of the murders so it was interesting to see how Faye built her case. **Dust and shadowed plunge** How can a book about the Ripper killings be fun? It is fun because the murderer is caught by none other than Sherlock Holmes! I don't know. **Dust and shadowjar gradle** Hardcover I started listening to the audiobook yesterday morning while trying to avoid having to go out into the snowy madness of town and then got distracted by doing household chores. **Comic book cover dust shadow** However there was a point where Faye's grumpy version Holmes (not how I see the original character but it may well be how Faye interprets him) hooked me right back into the story. **Dust and shadow by lyndsay faye** I still had a problem with mixing in real characters or events with fiction and since this story focuses on Holmes hunting down Jack the Ripper the plot was always going to be at the risk of not working for me. **Dust and shadowjar gradle** That said if someone was tying Holmes in with real historical events then I'd rather it'd be the Ripper murders because a) the lack of resolution to that particular puzzle shrouds the events in so much mystery all the things that usually annoy me about authors getting historical facts wrong just doesn't apply here and b) there was a notion that (in real life) Dr. **Review of book of dust** Then there were what I perceived to be a few things that didn't work with the timeline of the original canon - the rejection of the knighthood at this point in Holmes bio doesn't work because it makes the discussion of the knighthood in the actual canon (set after the events of Faye's story) somewhat redundant. **Dust and shadowdark character** Fun fact: According to Daniel Stashower's biography of ACD (Teller of Tales: The Life of Arthur Conan Doyle) ACD had considered rejecting his own knighthood but was persuaded by his mother to accept it. **Dust and Shadow publishing** The only thing that really didn't work for me was that at the end of the story Holmes is asked to do something - and agrees to do something - that is not in his character. **Dust and shadowfen** Watson); beautifully wrought historical details (the result of excellent research without any self-indulgent extraneous information); appropriate angst and humor and peril in the service of a well-designed plot; and the expert incorporation of the Jack the Ripper events and mythos into a truly haunting Gothic tale,
